Co-Chairs are Val Baughman and Michelle Moore.

Pastor Sarah West offered the following reasoning for making the change, "Recently the term D.E.I. has been co-opted by the culture wars. In our congregation the term has become a stumbling block in the pursuit of bringing people together. In the best interest of this congregation and in the best interest of this committee's long term sustainability the name will change. The mission of the committee has not changed. The good work that has been accomplished over the last few years will continue just under a new name. The new name describes the core mission to welcome ALL people without exceptions and signifies a posture of Unity - "WE" are one body in Christ.

From our visioning standpoint, it also helps to fulfill the part of our FCC Mission Statement to, "build a Community of belonging for all."

Currently the committee is working on hearing accessibility. (hearing loop, closed caption), and other aging friendly options for our church.

Shalom from Shelby

In her book An Altar in the World, Barbara Brown Taylor writes about the importance and difficulty of prayer. She writes of her struggles with prayer practices and all the ways she has tried to embody a life of prayer. I'm hesitant to admit that I identify with her in her struggles! When life gets busy, it can be hard to make time for a prayer practice. When I pray when I get in bed, I inevitably fall asleep before I'm finished. You would think that a pastor would have the whole prayer thing nailed down (don't they teach that in seminary?!) but alas, I find it difficult. Barbara Brown Taylor's book helped me reframe a life of prayer in a way that made sense for my life.

She writes about her discovery of an Austrian Benedictine named Brother David Steindl-Rast and the way one of his books changed her perspective on prayer. "Brother David," she writes, "was the first person to tell me that prayer is not the same thing as prayers. Prayers are important, he said. Saying psalms in the morning is a good way to head into the day more prayerfully. So is going to church, where I can add my voice to those of a whole congregation aiming to woo God's ears with their ancient, beautiful cadences. Still, prayer is more than saying set prayers at set times. Prayer, according to Brother David, is waking up to the presence of God no matter where I am or what I am doing. When I am fully alert to whatever or whoever is right in front of me; when I am electrically aware of the tremendous gift of being alive; when I am able to give myself wholly to the moment I am in, then I am in prayer. Prayer is happening and it is not necessarily something that I am doing. God is happening, and I am lucky enough to know that I am in The Midst" (178).

Now, I'm not saying that more traditional prayer practices aren't valuable - I have found so much value in various practices throughout my life. We even did an instagram series on prayer practices a couple of years ago that I encourage you to revisit on our church instagram page (it's under our "LENT" highlight)! What I am saying is that a life of prayer doesn't have to entail a perfect ritual. God is present with us whether or not we begin with "Dear God" and end with "Amen." If you are in a season of life where thinking about prayer brings more shame than peace, I encourage you to rethink your approach. Your practice of prayer is between you and God, and it can manifest in so many different ways.


