Disaster Clean Up Buckets

It's September again, the month we fill five gallon buckets with cleaning supplies. These are sent to help with recovery after disasters such as floods, fires, tornadoes, and hurricanes.

We're doing something a little different this year. Half our items can be ordered off Amazon and shipped directly to the church. No more going from store to store trying to find the right size listed on the tag you took from the display in the Gathering Area. To place your order just go [Amazon Bucket Brigade List](#).

The other half of the items will still have tags for you to take like before, but the items can all be purchased at the Dollar Tree here in Wadsworth by Home Depot. Since the shopping will be easier this year, our goal is to fill 40 buckets.

We need to include \$3.00 to ship each bucket to where it is needed, so if you would like to make a donation to help cover that, please put it in the offering or bring it into the office. Checks can be made out to First Christian Church with "Bucket Shipping" on the memo line.

On behalf of the grateful people you will be helping with these buckets, thank you for your generosity, and thank you for your thoughtfulness of others in need.

Musings From the Minister

Fall Book Study "Making Sense of the Bible"

October 8 - November 19

One of my favorite workshops at this year's General Assembly was led by the preeminent Disciples historian, D. Duane Cummins, who has just released an updated edition of his seminal history of our denomination, "The Disciples: A Struggle for Reformation". His lecture reminded me once again of what I consider the best and most challenging aspect of being a Disciple - the freedom to read and interpret the scriptures for ourselves. While most of us cherish the freedom our church espouses to read the Bible and employ our God given gift of reason to study and interpret it for ourselves, the hard truth is that all of us have fallen short of the responsibility that goes along with this freedom. To educate ourselves about the book we say we base our beliefs indeed our very lives on.

This fall all of us will have the opportunity to learn more about this sacred text that guides our understanding of God, ourselves and our world in our fall book study "Making Sense of the Bible" by Adam Hamilton.

In "Making Sense of the Bible", Adam Hamilton invites us into an honest conversation about the Bible. The book begins with foundational questions such as; How and when was the Bible written? Who decided which books made it into the scriptures and why? How literally must we read it? and, Is the Bible ever wrong?

From there, Hamilton considers the real questions people frequently ask that continue to divide Christians and denominations alike, including:

- Were Adam and Eve real people?
- Why is God so violent in the Old Testament?
- Why would Paul command women to "keep silent in the church"?
- Is Jesus the only way to salvation?
- How does God view homosexual people?
- Is the Book of Revelation a guide to the End Times?

My hope is that by the end of this study you will have gained important tools to help you read the Bible and explore what YOU think and believe. The goal is not to walk away believing what Adam Hamilton believes, the goal is to gain a deeper understanding of this sacred text so that you might hear God speak through it and find it to be a well of living water that will sustain you all the days of your life.



Children's Sunday School Illness Policy

We want all our children to remain healthy this winter season, and so we ask that you follow these guidelines as set forth by the Children's Christian Education Committee. Please keep your child at home if he/she exhibits any of the following symptoms: Runny Nose (Yellow or green in color/consistency); Fever (Until 24 hours after it has broken); Questionable rashes; Coughing/Croupy coughs; Diarrhea (Until 24 hours after last occurrence). If your child has a continually clear runny nose or rash due to non-contagious allergies, please let the CCED volunteers know.

Please contact the Church office within 24 hours if your child should come down with a communicable disease such as: Chicken Pox, Strep Throat/Scarlet Fever, or Pink Eye after they have been in Sunday school or Extended Session. Upon receiving the information that a child in a classroom has a communicable disease, we will send out a postcard to inform families in that classroom and will post a note outside the classroom. Thank you for your cooperation.


Picnic and Softball Dodged the Rain!

It was a beautiful afternoon for golf at the Pine Valley Golf Club.


14 of our FCC guys and guests scrambled to secure this year's bragging rights. After several long drives, chips, and putts, the dust settled, and strokes were counted.


Join us this fall as we get together as guys over a cup of coffee to form some REAL bonds and get to know each other and our God a little better.



Our guys who participated in the forum sessions last year were especially inspired by Derek’s honest and authentic approach to his faith...especially as conveyed in his short YouTube videos which accompanied some of our sessions. Who is Derek Maul? Derek was raised in England, then became a naturalized American after graduating from Stetson University in Florida (where he studied psychology, played soccer, and met his wife, Rebekah). Derek added a degree in education and became known for his innovative work with emotional disturbed and autistic children. As a Presbyterian pastor’s spouse, Derek helped redefine and reinvigorate ministry to men. Eight books, countless articles, and a widely read blog have created a national platform to share his passion for life and for following Jesus. 
We are extending an invitation to other churches and our community to this event, so please invite your friends and others who you think would like to join us.




