God Widens the Narrow Door (Luke 13: 22-30)

The frequent human inclination to operate as though resources and opportunities are scarce presents itself in the question of someone Jesus encountered during his journey to the Passover in Jerusalem. "Lord, will only a few be saved," the man asked.

Many scholars agree the man was someone who felt certain of his own salvation – whether because he was following the rules, because of his connection to the lineage of Abraham, or for other reasons. But how many would be saved along with him? Jesus responded with a parable about people arriving at a house for a party and being denied entry by the owners, who said they did not know the visitors, despite the visitors' claims of a friendship with them. The message, perhaps, is that none of us should assume that our connection to God is stronger or that our relationship with God is more special than that of anyone else.

Jesus follows the parable with the promise that far from "a few" being saved, "people will come from east and west, from north and south, and will eat in the kingdom of God."

Our God is one of abundance. Just as God welcomes people from all directions to the kingdom (and kindom) of God, so has God created the earth with enough resources for us all. We need only remember that everyone is deserving of them.

How is your stewardship reflected in this parable? Do you operate as though there is only enough for you, or do you model generosity and gratitude for God's provision?

Musings From the Minister

The Secret of Contentment

I read an interesting article recently which interviewed people living out the final decades of their lives. They were asked what advice they would give their younger selves. Many people responded by saying they wished they had spent less time worrying about achieving financial success and acquiring things and more quality time with the people in their lives. As a pastor, I have learned a tremendous amount from spending time with people at the end of their lives. Their perspective and wisdom has been an invaluable reminder to prioritize people over possessions, gratitude over regrets and love over everything else.

This Thanksgiving season, I invite all of us to take to heart this wisdom and ask ourselves, "What is the secret to contentment?" The apostle Paul, who endured great hardship and suffering, wrote the following in his letter to the people in Philippi,

I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength. - Philippians 4:11-13

True contentment is rooted not in our external circumstances, but by abiding in Jesus Christ and learning to depend on his strength in times of abundance and in times of scarcity.

As I come to terms with my cancer diagnosis and upcoming treatments, I am having to face the reality of not being able to control my circumstances. This prospect is frankly maddening because I am a planner and a doer. But I am going to try my best to follow the wise teachings of my spiritual elders and turn to Christ as my source of strength, solace and joy. What a gift to find in Jesus, the Living Water, a never failing stream of life.

Those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.' - John 4:14

May we not wait until the end of our days to learn true contentment in the life-giving love of Jesus.


Junior Youth Fellowship (JYF)



Nov. 6 - Holding the Ungraspable (Chapter 8)


Nov. 13 - Reversing Columbine (Chapter 9)

FCC Fills 40 Emergency Clean Up Buckets

We are a goal achieving congregation! Because of the generosity of FCC, our youth and their adult volunteers were able to pack 40 buckets with 15 different items that are needed for cleaning up after disasters. Cash donations that were received were used to purchase the remaining items on the Amazon wish list, and the last few items on the tags that were left. Even the \$120 shipping was covered by a donation. Thank you First Christian for your generosity!

The buckets were taken to a Disciples church in Massillon where they will be picked up and taken to the Church World Service warehouse in Elkhart, Indiana. From there they will be shipped out to wherever there is a need. Because they may be shipped by air, aerosol cans could not be accepted. Because of space limitations in the buckets, laundry detergent bottles larger than the ounces specified on the tags could not be accepted. When those items came in, they were donated to Wadsworth FISH, who was happy to receive them and distribute them to those in need in our community.



Coffee Collection

The Haven of Rest in Akron needs coffee to serve the poor and homeless who come through their doors. A warm meal and a hot cup of coffee on a cold winter's day are a welcome beginning to the positive changes this ministry brings about in the lives of the destitute people they serve.
